

JUNIOR FAIR BEEF CATTLE

- 1. Entry Day **Tuesday, August 24,** 10am-11:30am, in the Multi-Purpose Building with unloading animals only on the north side of the Multi-Purpose building. Weigh-in and scanning to follow swine, sheep and goats. Must be stalled by 11:45am, scanning to follow. All animals must have a halter on.
- 2. Judging Day Wednesday, August 25, starting at 3:30pm or one hour following sheep, Multi-Purpose Building.
- 3. Release Day Sunday, August 29, starting at 5pm for market beef and 5:30pm for beef returning home.
- 4. Stalls will be assigned by the Junior Fair Beef Cattle Superintendent. All exhibitors must show with the youth organization whose leader approved the entry. Junior Fair exhibitors must keep beef with the Junior Fair exhibit.
- 5. Each exhibitor must care for and feed the animal or make arrangements to have the animal fed. All animals must be kept clean, fed, watered and in place until checkout time on Sunday. An inspection will be done daily after 9:00am by the superintendent. If an animal is determined to be neglected in any way by the superintendent or Expo board member, the area will have a flag posted notifying the exhibitor. Failure to keep pen clean and animal fed could result in forfeiture of premiums and excluded from participation the following fair year.
- 6. No more than four (4) animals may be exhibited in Junior Fair with a max of two (2) animals per lot number. However, only one (1) animal to be exhibited in classes B, C, and D. No changes will be allowed after registration forms are submitted.
- 7. **Only one (1) animal allowed in the sale.** After final weigh-in, steers will be divided into three (3) weight classes: Light-Medium-Heavy, **if numbers allow**. Each beef exhibitor may enter four (4) animals. Only one (1) can be shown in each lot number. (This will be determined by the superintendent).
- 8. Champion Ribbons and/or trophies will not be awarded unless there is competition.
- 9. **HEALTH REGULATIONS**: See WI County, District, & State Fairs **2021** Animal Health Rules and Regulations located on the Web site. Any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during the fair.
- 10. Exhibitors must show their own animals. The same animal must be used for all heats and finals. If assistance is needed, it will be provided by the ring help. Unruly animals will be tied up on the side of the show ring.
- 11. WI Hereford Women will present awards to the top showmen of Polled Hereford or Hereford cattle in the youth organizations which include 4-H, FFA, in the Junior Intermediate and Senior Divisions.
- 12. JUNIOR FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR THEIR EXHIBITOR NUMBERED HAT/HARNESS WHILE SHOWING. FAILURE TO WEAR THE EXHIBITOR NUMBER WILL RESULT IN PREMIUM MONEY FORFEITURE!

All Exhibitors in this department must call the Superintendent no later than August 1 with the number of animals they will be bringing. If Exhibitor is Over/Under by more than one animal, there will be a penalty of not exhibiting at the next Manitowoc County Fair.
