plan within 60 days after the population count by block established in the decennial federal census
of population and maps showing the location and numbering of census blocks become available
in printed form from the federal government or are published for distribution by a state agency,
but not later than July 1 following the year of the decennial census; and

WHEREAS, a county is required to solicit suggestions from the municipalities concerning the development of an appropriate plan and to submit the tentative supervisory district plan that it adopts to each municipal governing body in the county so that each municipality in the county can adjust its wards as required by Wis. Stat. § 5.15; and

WHEREAS, the county board is required to hold a public hearing and adopt a final supervisory district plan within 60 days after every municipality in the county has adjusted its wards; and
