### RESOLUTION SUPPORTING INCREASED STATE UTILITY TAX PAYMENTS

### TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

1	WHEREAS, public utilities are generally exempt from local property taxes and taxed
2	instead by the state of Wisconsin under Wis. Stat. ch. 76; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, in lieu of payment through local property taxes, the state gives a portion of
5	the amounts it collects to counties and municipalities through a shared revenue utility aid payment;
6	and
7	
8	WHEREAS, shared revenue utility aid payments help counties and municipalities pay for
9	services provided to the tax-exempt utility property; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, these shared revenue utility aid payments are also viewed as partial
12	compensation for the air pollution, noise, traffic congestion, and land use limitations caused by the
13	presence of utility property; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, the state has historically retained about eighty percent of utility tax collections
16	for use as General Purpose Revenue, rather than return those dollars to counties and municipalities
17	where the utilities are located; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, in 2019-20, the state collected \$351.4 million in utility taxes, but only
20	returned \$75.6 million to local governments as utility aid, and
21	
22	WHEREAS, payments generated through the current utility aid formula have largely been
23	stagnant, both as a percentage of tax collections and in the actual dollars distributed to counties
24	and municipalities; and

26	WHEREAS, stagnant or declining aid has resulted in a burdensome shift in taxes to owners
27	of the remaining taxable property in the county;

## RESOLUTION RATIFYING COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S JANUARY 5, 2021, PROCLAMATION OF CONTINUING PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

#### TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

1	WHEREAS, in December 2019, COVID-19, a contagious and potentially fatal respiratory
2	disease, was first identified and has since spread to many countries, including the United States;
3	and
4	
5	WHEREAS, the outbreak of COVID-19 and the effects of its risk of person-to-person
6	transmission has significantly affected the lives and health of Manitowoc County citizens, as well
7	as the County's economy; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak, on March 16, 2020, County Executive
10	Bob Ziegelbauer issued a proclamation declaring a public health emergency in Manitowoc County
11	due to the COVID-19 pandemic for 60 days, which was ratified by the Board of Supervisors of the
12	County of Manitowoc on March 17, 2020; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, on May 15, 2020, July 14, 2020, September 15, 2020, November 5, 2020, the
15	County Executive issued proclamations declaring a continuing public health emergency in
16	Manitowoc County for additional 60 day time periods because the COVID-19 pandemic had not
17	yet fully abated and continued to pose an imminent threat of disaster in Manitowoc County; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Manitowoc ratified those
20	proclamations on May 19, 2020, July 21, 2020, September 15, 2020, and November 5, 2020,
21	respectively; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, to date, the COVID-19 pandemic still has not fully abated and continues to
24	pose an imminent threat of disaster within the meaning of Wis. Stat. ch. 323 that impacts the health,
25	security, and safety of the public and could impair critical systems of Manitowoc County; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, it is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, protection, and welfare of
28	persons within Manitowoc County, to continue taking reasonable and prudent steps to treat those
29	infected with COVID-19 and to prevent, limit, and contain the potential community spread of
30	COVID-19; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, consistent with Wis. Stat. § 323.14(4)(b), on January 5, 2021, the Manitowoc
33	County Executive issued another continuing proclamation declaring an ongoing public health
34	emergency in Manitowoc County due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and
35	
36	WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 323.14(4)(b), the continuing proclamation is "subject
37	to ratification, alteration, modification or repeal by the governing body as soon thereafter as that
38	body can meet, but the subsequent action taken by the governing body shall not affect the prior
39	validity of the proclamation"; and

-1	WHEREAS, ratifying the County Executive's proclamation declaring a state of continuing			
-2	emergency will facilitate and expedite the use of resources to protect persons from the impacts of			
-3	the spread of COVID-19 while ensuring continuity of critical operations within Manitowoc County			
4	as well as permitting the County to properly plan for and use County facilities, temporarily re-			
-5	assign staff, and expend necessary funds to support any upcoming vaccination effort;

-8	County of Manitowoc hereby ratifies the January 5, 2021 proclamation by the Manitowoc County
