How to "Freeze" Your Credit Report

A credit freeze allows you to seal your credit reports and use a personal identification number (PIN) that only you know and can use to temporarily "thaw" your credit when legitimate applications for credit and services need to be processed. The added layer of security means that thieves can't establish new credit in your name even if they are able to obtain your personal information. It has no effect on existing lines of credit. A freeze needs to be placed at all three credit bureaus (see below). In Wisconsin, the cost is \$10/bureau.
