# Rules to Know

Removal of any natural items, rocks, trees, or plants is prohibited.

No hunting or trapping.

No fires except at grills in designated picnic areas.

Camping by permit only.

Dogs on a leash are permitted. All animal waste must be cleaned up.

No motorized vehicles or bicycles.

No violent, loud, vulgar, indecent, or otherwise disorderly conduct.

No littering or dumping of off-site waste.

# About

Walla Hi County Park consists of 160 acres and was acquired in 1977. The park features a scenic drive along with several trails winding through the beautiful Kettle Moraine landscape. One of the park's most appealing characteristics is the great diversity of environments, varying from heavily wooded areas to large open expanses. The park also contains several small springs flowing into crystal clear streams. Hiking and picnicking are among the most popular activities in Walla Hi, with hiking trails also ideally suited for cross country skiing during the winter months. Walla Hi also offers equestrian trails for your enjoyment. These equestrian trails are maintained by The Plymouth Trail Riders, a non-profit Sheboygan County based riding organization. Their mission is to promote horsemanship by providing the opportunity for horsemen to get together socially and educationally through horse related activities. Walla Hi also contains a portion of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail, managed by the Ice Age Trail Alliance. Their vision is to create a continuous, permanently protected trail where all people can enjoy and embrace the unique natural landscapes and cultural histories of Wisconsin. This portion of trail is just a small part of a thousand-mile footpath that traces Ice Age formations across Wisconsin.

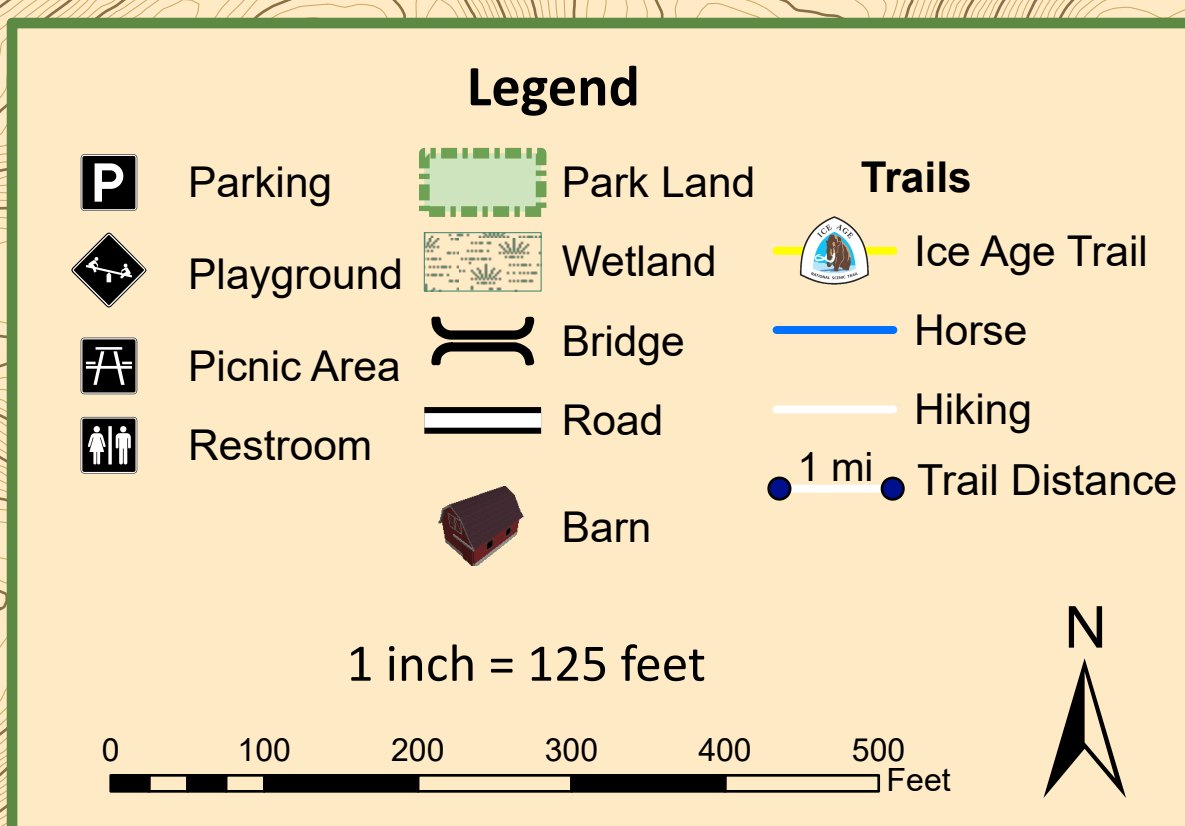
