JUNIOR FAIR DAIRY CATTLE

- Entry Day Wednesday, August 20. Animals must be in place by 12pm (noon) in the Dairy Cattle Barn. Animals may be stalled starting at 4pm on Tuesday. The milk parlor will be open starting at 5am on Entry Day (Wednesday).
- Judging Day Friday, August 22, starting with the cow classes at 9am, Ice Center. Showmanship judging on Thursday following Open Class Dairy, Ice Center.
- Release Day Sunday, August 24, starting at 5:30pm. Please note straw and bedding must be pulled at least two (2) feet away from the head of the stall at the conclusion of fair. Displays may not be removed any earlier than 5:30pm.
- 4. If valid registration papers are not presented to the Dairy Superintendent by 5pm on Wednesday (entry day), the registered animal will not be allowed to be shown.
- 5. Animals exhibited in Open Class, cannot be shown in Junior Fair, this includes showmanship.
- 6. Stalls will be assigned by the Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Superintendent. All exhibitors must show with the youth organization whose leader approved the entry. Junior Fair exhibitors must keep dairy cattle with the Junior Fair exhibit.
- 7. Each exhibitor must care for and feed the animal or make arrangements to have the animal fed or cared for and cleaned. All animals must be kept clean, fed, watered and in place until checkout time on Sunday. An inspection will be done daily after 8am by the Superintendent. If an animal is determined to be neglected in any way by the Superintendent and/or Expo board member, the Exhibitor will be notified. Failure to keep pen clean and animal fed could result in forfeiture of premiums an possibly excluded from participation the following fair year.
- 8. Junior Fair dairy exhibitors may enter six (6) animals, but may show a maximum of four (4) animals. Each exhibitor must pay a manure fee per animal, with a maximum of four (4) animals. Exhibitors may enter two (2) animals per lot number, but only one (1) animal per lot number may be exhibited.
- 9. In all breed classes, grade and purebreds will be shown together.
- 10. Animals shown in the Red and White Holstein classes must have a red and white haircoat.
- 11. Champion Ribbons and/or trophies will not be awarded to animals unless there is competition, but the animal is eligible for consideration for champion.
- 12. All dairy animals exhibited must be the exhibitors own Junior Fair Dairy project.
- 13. ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE A PERMANENT ID NUMBER, EAR TAG OR TATTOO TO BE SHOWN AT FAIR. TAGS ARE AVAILABLE FROM DHIA, VETERINARIANS, AI TECHNICIANS, ETC.
- 14. HEALTH REGULATIONS: See WI County, District, and State Fairs **2025** Animal Health Rules and Regulations located on the website. Any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during the fair.
- 15. It is suggested that at least thirty (30) days prior to the Manitowoc County Fair, all dairy animals receive a 9-way and a Pasturella vaccination. The 9-way vaccine may be administered as either a modified live (one injection needed) or a killed vaccine (initial injection followed two-four weeks later with a booster). Modified live vaccines should be used on non-pregnant animals only. Please consult your veterinarian.
- 16. State regulations prohibit the sale of milk for human consumption that is produced other than in proper facilities. The dairy cattle exhibitors have voted that the proceeds from the sale of milk produced at the fair be used to improve dairy facilities. Thank you for your cooperation!
- 17. Finish or touch up clipping will be allowed in designated areas by exhibitors, family members and/or leaders. It is recommended that body clipping be done prior to the fair.
- 18. Dairy exhibitors must show their own Junior Fair Dairy animals. For selection of Junior, Senior, and Grand Champion, a Junior Fair Exhibitor must show the animal. The same animal must be used in all heats and finals. If assistance is needed, it will be provided by the ring help.
- 19. Unruly animals will be asked to leave the ring. The judge has the authority to discuss unruly animals.
- 20. JUNIÓR FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR WHITES AND THEIR EXHIBITOR NUMBERS WHILE SHOWING. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE RULES MAY RESULT IN PREMIUM FORFEITURE, DISQUALIFICATION, AND/OR BEING PLACED LAST IN THE CLASS! Rule violations will be dealt with as soon as possible by the dairy superintendent and the 4-H dairy committee.
- 21. Culvers Futurity animals must enter in Lot number 157-163 and register under Dept 101, Class H, Lot 114. To register for future Futurity shows, please visit the Fair Website and complete the Dairy Futurity Entry Form.
- 22. All Dairy Leaders must call the Dairy Superintendent no later than **August 6** with the number of cows, yearlings and calves to be exhibited.
- 23. There must be fifteen (15) animals entered per breed in order to have their own show.
- 24. All county dairy exhibitors must attend a YQCA training between September 1, 2024 through August 15, 2025 of the fair year.
- 25. Late Arrival Request If show animal are participating at Wisconsin Summer Championship Show, exhibitor MUST submit a Late Arrival Request letter to the Manitowoc County Fair office via email to JennellShelton@manitowoccountywi.gov no later than July 15. Requests will be reviewed at the August Board meeting.

Any exhibitor who exhibits in Dept 1 (ATCP 160.15) is eligible. **Exhibitor must show their own Junior Fair Dairy project animal.** You must make an entry on your registration blank to participate in Showmanship. Showmanship is judged in order by numeric lot numbers. The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) scorecard will be followed.

CLASS C: BRED AND OWNED (RIBBON AWARD ONLY)

MANITOWOC COUNTY FAIR PRODUCTION AWARDS

- 1. The Manitowoc County Fair will award one (1) plaque to the exhibitor(s) of the highest production record at the Manitowoc County Fair.
- 2. The plaque will be presented to the exhibitor showing the cow with the highest combined butterfat and protein record (CFP).
- 3. To be eligible to compete for the production award, the exhibitor must meet the following requirements:
 - a. Animal must be entered through an approved youth organization (4-H, FFA, Jr. Holstein Association, Girl/Boy Scouts) project at the Manitowoc County Fair.
 - b. Only Official DHIA or DHIR records will be accepted.
 - c. The DHIA record must be signed by the DHIA field technician supervising the record, the youth organization leader and the youth exhibitor.
 - d. The last completed 305 day record is required and must have completed the 305 day record sometime after **August 1**, **2025**. Awards will be presented based on actual 305 day records. 3X records will not be discounted.
 - e. Entries, production records, and their certification are to be sent to the Angie Ulness, Manitowoc County U-W Extension Agriculture Educator, by **August 1**. Entries submitted after this date will not be accepted. All entries must be signed.
 - f. The award winner will be announced and the plaque presented during the Cow Classes of the Junior Fair Dairy Show on Friday morning.
- 4. Awards cannot be received more than once for the same record.

HERD BUILDER AWARD

The First Place entry in this contest receives a registered heifer calf courtesy of GreenStone Farm Credit Services and Parnell Living Science. Any Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Exhibitor age 12-15 as of **January 1, 2025**, may enter. Scoring is based on the exhibitor's knowledge, interest, and enthusiasm in their dairy project and the number of animals exhibited. Any Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Exhibitor age 16-19 as of **January 1, 2025**, is eligible to enter. Scoring is based on the exhibitor's knowledge, interest, and enthusiasm in their dairy project. FARM BUREAU KIDDIE SHOWMANSHIP

The Farm Bureau Young Farmers again will be sponsoring a Kiddie Showmanship Show at the Manitowoc County Fair. The show will be on Sunday, **August 24**, **2025**, at 11:30am in the Ice Center Show Ring. Requirements:

- Calf must be born between <u>April 15, 2025 and August 1, 2025</u>. [We ask that everyone <u>please</u> abide by this rule.]
 Calf can be either a heifer or a bull that is healthy and well grown. It must be a dairy animal. <u>NO</u> animal that is shown in open class or junior fair may be used in the Farm Bureau Kiddie Showmanship event. A second calf may be entered in the event if the first calf is not show ring ready.
- 2. There will be four (4) classes: **4-year-old Preschool, Kindergarten, 1**st **Grade, and 2**nd **Grade.** These classes are grades the children completed in 2025.
- 3. Calves must be at the fairgrounds by 10:30 a.m. on Sunday and taken home after the show because there will be no barn space available. Check-in will be in the show ring.
- 4. Children are **not** required to wear white clothing and calves need not be clipped.
- 5. Children will be required to wear a number, which will be passed out prior to the show. The order of the children is preselected and will enter the ring in numerical order.
- 6. Children will be judged on the way they handle the calf and their basic showmanship skills.
- 7. If you have children in more than one age group, they may show the same calf, however, **THIS IS DISCOURAGED** because the young aged calves tire easily. If you have two children in the same age group, they will need two calves.
- 8. Ribbons will be awarded.
- 9. To be eligible to enter the Kiddie Showmanship event, you must complete a Google Docs Registration Form available online at 2025 Manitowoc County Farm Bureau Kiddie Showmanship.
