- 1. Judging Day (Individual Conference Judging) **Monday, August 18,** as follows: 10am to 2pm and 2:30pm to 6pm in the Exhibition Building.
- Release Day Sunday, August 24, between 6pm and 7:30pm. Vehicle access begins at 6:30pm. Vehicle access will begin at 6:30pm through the northwest corner of the Main Parking lot (across the street from Meijer). Watch for signs. Line Up begins at 6:25pm. Exhibits released prior to release date and time will not receive premiums.
- Open to members enrolled in Celebrate Art, Art in Your Future, Palette of Fun, Block Printing, Metal Enameling, Drawing & Painting, Theatre Arts, Clowning, Leathercraft, or doing equivalent work.
- 4. Four (4) entries or exhibits per class per exhibitor.
- 5. One (1) entry per exhibit per lot number.
- 6. Entry tags must be securely attached to the upper corner of all articles entered with string, safety pins, staples, etc. Smaller items can be placed in a clear plastic bag with entry tag stapled to the bag. Rules and regulations apply to all classes in Cultural Arts.
- 7. Class B Exhibitor must have visible date on front or back.
- 8. Class D Each piece must be dated and have initials on bottom of the ceramic piece.
- 9. Identify all "any other" exhibit on entry tag and registration form.

#### **CLASS A: LEATHER CRAFT**

#### Lot Numbers:

- 100. Belt from a kit.
- 101. Bookmarks, coasters, jewelry, etc.
- 102. Creative article for the home.
- 103. Leather Collage.
- 104. Leather item dyed or painted.
- 105. Leathercraft item, simple, made from a kit.
- 106. Poster on Leathercraft 14"x22" (tools, equipment, etc).
- 107. Small Cases ruler, eyeglass, tool, scissors, etc.
- 108. Wallet, purse, handbag, coin purse, etc.
- 109. Wearable item, NOT already listed (i.e., gloves, moccasins).
- 110. Any other leather craft exhibit not listed above, identify.

#### **CLASS B: PAINTING AND DRAWING**

- 1. Picture must be 8"x10" or larger Visible date on front or back.
- 2. Chalk, pencil and charcoal drawings should be sprayed to prevent smudging.
- Pictures should be framed, matted or finished in some manner on sturdy mounting board or a heavy tag board.
- Each picture frame must be equipped with a suitable, sturdy hanging device. Pictures will be stapled for display
  unless they can be hung.
- 5. No sand art. (Refer to Class F Any Other Art or Craft, lot number 193).

#### **CLASS C: STENCIL PAINTING**

- 1. Judging on stenciling only.
- 2. Smaller items can be placed in a clear plastic bag with the entry tag stapled to the bag.
- 3. No stencil decals are allowed.

#### Lot Numbers:

- 128. Cloth napkins (2), Placemats (2) or Handkerchiefs (2)
- 129. On Fabric, not listed in Lot 128
- 130. Stationery sheets or greeting cards with envelopes (3 each)
- 131. Stenciling on metal pie tin, etc. (finish edges)
- 132. Stenciling on wood/cheese box, barn wood, shingle, etc.
- 133. Towels (2)
- 134. Wall decoration with hanger.
- 135. Any other stencil painting exhibit not listed, identify.

# CLASS D: CERAMICS (ARTICLE FORMED IN A MOLD AND FIRED)

- 1. Not responsible for breakage.
- 2. Each lot number may be 2 small (6" or under) or 1 large (over 6").
- 3. Each piece MUST be DATED and have your INITIALS ON THE BOTTOM of the ceramic piece.

#### Lot Numbers:

- 136. Acrylic and Antiqued Item
- 137. Airbrushed Item
- 138. Ceramic Jewelry, any technique
- 139. Dry Brushed Item
- 140. Fired on Decal
- 141. Fired Luster, an Iridescent Finish
- 142. Fired Metallic such as Gold, Platinum or Copper
- 143. Glazed clear or opaque
- 144. Special effect on glazed item (decal, glitter, snow, etc).
- 145. Specialty glazed (crystal, crackle, mother-of-pearl, etc).
- 146. Using 3 or more techniques
- 147. Any other ceramics exhibit not listed, identify.

#### **CLASS E: RECYCLED ART**

- 1. Recycled materials into a creative item. Sewing or stitching is allowed.
- 2. List recycled items used on back of entry tag.

#### **Lot Numbers:**

- 148. Cans coffee, vegetable, soda, etc.
- 149. Collage 14"x22".
- 150. Creative use of old greeting cards (3) ornaments, postcards, gift tags, etc.
- 151. Doll or Animal.
- 152. Grocery bag or plastic bags.

- 153. Jewelry earrings, necklace, pin, barrettes, etc.
- 154. Old clothing or scrap fabric.
- 155. Plastic milk jugs or soda bottles.
- 156. Use of Machinery Parts
- 157. Any other recycled art exhibit not listed, identify.

#### **CLASS F: ANY OTHER ART OR CRAFT**

- No sewing or stitchery of any kind. This includes cross-stitching on plastic canvas. (If interested in sewing or stitchery, refer to Department 26 – Clothing; if interested in cross stitching on plastic canvas, refer to Department 28 – Home Furnishings-Home Environment)
- All wall hangings must be equipped with a suitable, sturdy, hanging device.
- 3. All entry tags must be securely attached to the upper right corner of articles entered. String, safety pins, stapled, etc. Small items can be placed in a clear plastic bag with entry tag stapled to bag.
- 4. Duct tape apparel see Department 26 Clothing.

# CLASS G: THEATRE ARTS, HAND PUPPETS, DANCE, AND CLOWNING

#### Lot Numbers:

- 207. Poster on any subject relating to drama 14"x 22" no hanger needed.
- 208. Puppet or marionette. Give a short description of use on an index card.
- 209. 3-dimensional model of a stage setting for a oneact play. Give the name of the play and write a brief description of the story on an index card.
- 210. Poster on clowns or clowning 14"x22" no hanger needed.

- 211. Scrapbook of your Drama Production, minimum of two (2) pages (4 sides) in covered protectors.
- 212. Scrapbook on any aspect of clowning, dance, or puppets – minimum of two (2) pages (4 sides) in covered protectors.
- 213. Display of Costume Created by Member.
- 214. Manuscript from a play or skit written by Member.
- 215. Any other theatre arts, puppetry, and clowning exhibit not listed, identify.

### **CLASS H: MUSIC**

#### Lot Numbers:

- 216. My original musical composition.
- My original composition of lyrics for an existing melody.
- My original composition of a melody for existing lyrics.
- 219. Instruments I have created to teach rhythm to young children.
- 220. History of my favorite musical instruments.
- 221. Poster created to promote a musical event.
- 222. Poster identifying a family of instruments woodwind, brass, string, or percussion.
