JUNIOR FAIR POULTRY

- Entry Day Wednesday, August 20, doors will open at 8am in the Poultry and Rabbit Building. All exhibits
 must be in place by 5pm. Weigh in will begin at 6pm. Identification paperwork must be completed and submitted
 to the superintendent prior to placement of animals in cages.
- Judging Day (Individual Conference Judging) Friday, August 22, starting at 9am, showmanship to follow. Doors will open at 8am. No parent(s) or other adult(s) other than the superintendent(s) are permitted in the judging ring.
- Release Day Sunday, August 24, from 5:30pm to 8pm. Claim checks will be required to have your poultry released. Dismantling of decorations and food clean out begins at 5pm, animals must remain in cage. Cages must be completely cleaned at the conclusion of fair. Failure to do so could result in loss of premium.
- 4. Only one (1) entry allowed per lot number per class per exhibitor.
- 5. Maximum of fourteen (14) entries in the department, not to include showmanship or Market Class. No more than four (4) entries per species.
- 6. An exhibit shall consist of birds hatched after **January 1, 2025** (young males & young females). Any birds hatched prior to **2025**, are classified adult males and adult females.
- 7. Please contact the superintendent by August 1, if exhibitor has a large breed that requires a double cage. ANY EXHIBITOR THAT MAKES CAGE ALTERATIONS WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT WILL FORFEIT THEIR PREMIUMS.
- 8. Exhibitor MUST notify the superintendent by August 1, the number of birds and breeds.
- 9. All poultry must be in possession of the exhibitor by June 1, of the fair year to receive the fair premium.
- 10. HEALTH REGULATIONS: See WI County, District, & State Fairs 2025 Animal Health Rules and Regulations located on the website. Any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during the fair.
- 11. PULLORUM Testing <u>All poultry</u> except pigeons must be certified Pullorum-Typhoid free. Exhibitors must have proof that their birds are pullorum free when bringing them in on entry day. Exhibitor must also submit a copy for permanent record. When purchasing young birds, ask for paperwork (documentation) stating the animal is pullorum free. Birds must be tested at least three (3) weeks prior to the Fair. <u>Testing is available by the Manitowoc County</u> <u>Rabbit & Poultry Committee. Please see page 6 of rules for dates and details</u>. Anyone not having proof of testing cannot bring birds into the fair. This is a federal law.
- 12. Turkeys will still need to provide proof of MG Testing.
- 13. Each exhibitor must furnish their own feed, provide bedding as well as clean and care for their own poultry on a daily basis. Please use shavings only as bedding in cages. Straw, hay, or cedar MUST NOT be used for bedding.
- 14. Cloverbuds or Tiny Tots: DO NOT ENTER THROUGH 4-H. Enter by contacting Cele Kuehnl at 920-323-3497 by July 31.
- 15. All birds, including ducks, geese and turkeys, must be banded with a number leg band. Leg bands can be purchased from the Superintendents. A list of numbers and colors should be supplied to the Superintendent on Entry Day.
- 16. All poultry exhibited must be raised and shown by the exhibitor. Any other youth exhibitor may show entry if approved by Superintendent. No changes will be allowed after registration forms are submitted.
- 17. No fowl, of any type or class, showing any evidence of disease may be exhibited at the Fair. If, at any time, any fowl in this department shows evidence of a contagious or infectious disease, the animal shall be removed from the exhibit and destroyed or returned to the owner, at the option of the State Department of Agriculture.
- 18. Junior Fair Poultry department is only open to members enrolled in the Poultry Project or doing equivalent work who have kept records of their project for at least three (3) months.
- 19. The American Standard of Perfection shall govern all specimens entered in this department and will be judged by comparison. Any entries not fitting the class will be placed down.
- 20. Exhibitors are encouraged to secure cages to prevent vandalism.
- 21. Exhibitors entered in the Market Classes and participating in the auction are required to send letters to potential buyers inviting them to bid on your top Blue Ribbon winners at the Auction on **Thursday, August 22.**
- 22. In all "Any Other" categories, breed must be named on registration form.
- 23. NO ANIMAL(S) SHALL BE SOLD IN OR FROM THE POULTRY AND RABBIT BUILDING DURING THE FAIR. A BULLETIN BOARD IS PROVIDED FOR ADVERTISING OF ANIMALS. ANY ANIMAL SELLING CAN BE DONE ON SUNDAY AFTER 6PM.
- 24. JUNIOR FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR THEIR EXHIBITOR NUMBER WHILE SHOWING. FAILURE TO WEAR THE EXHIBITOR NUMBER WILL RESULT IN PREMIUM MONEY FORFEITURE!
- 25. Poultry and Rabbit Building will be open: Wednesday through Friday at 8am; Saturday and Sunday at 9am. 26. Exhibitors entering in poultry are required to complete the YQCA Training and attend two (2) educational
- meetings. Educational meetings must include one (1) poultry meeting and one (1) from a different species. 27. Showmanship is Class U. All exhibitors must participate and register in showmanship.

All Breeds must have at least six (6) entries and two (2) exhibitors to receive trophies and/or rosettes

HERDMANSHIP

Poultry and Rabbit Herdsmanship is judged as one (1) entry as they are set up together in one (1) area. Each club (4-H, FFA, etc.) is expected to judge every other club, except their own. If someone from your club does not participate in judging, your club may be excluded from being awarded any prize money or a trophy. Herdsmanship papers are available from the superintendent.

Herdsmanship ribbons will be given to the ten (10) top clubs and/or youth groups in the Poultry area. The following items will be considered in making the final decision: Preparation of the Exhibit, Appearance and Attitude of Exhibitors and Care of Exhibit (food & water, cleanliness of cage), Decorations (fair theme and fair colors), storage of supplies. Donated Herdsmanship Awards paid for by the Manitowoc Poultry and Rabbit Committee.

KIDDIE (OR TINY TOT) SHOWMANSHIP

Each Exhibitor must bring his or her own animal. Exhibitor cannot use a poultry entered in another class by another exhibitor. Rosette ribbons will be awarded along with Champion and Reserve Champion Trophies. No cash prizes. Enter by calling Cele Kuehnl at 920-323-3497 with the breed and sex of the animal you want to enter. Call between August 1 and 15. If there is no answer, please leave your information on the answering machine. Do not call the 4-H Office or Expo Office. Call no later than **August 15**.

Exhibitors entering into Kiddie (or Tiny Tot) Showmanship may not enter the same animal into Open Class.

Entry must be brought in on **Wednesday**, **August 20** by 6pm. The animal must stay the duration of the fair. **Do Not** send your entry to the 4-H office or the Expo office.

POULTRY AND RABBIT MARKET SALE

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To provide Junior Fair Poultry and Rabbit Exhibitors an opportunity to sell top quality poultry and rabbits at the Manitowoc County Fair.
- 2. To provide incentive and encourage a stronger development of white meat animal project.
- 3. To recognize members who do quality work in breeding, selecting, feeding, and showing the market poultry & rabbits.
- 4. Processing of Market Animals if assistance is required, please contact the Poultry and Rabbit committee. Any cost for processing will be deducted from sale winnings.

WHAT WILL BE OFFERED

- 1. Poultry to be auctioned will be the Champion winners in each of the poultry market classes (lot numbers 117-121).
- 2. Rabbits to be auctioned will be the Champion winners in each of the rabbit market classes (lot numbers 120-123).
- 3. Note: Please enter your animals in the market classes and Poultry and Rabbit Market Sale Only if you intend for the animal to be sold and processed. Since only the Champion entries in each market class are eligible for the Auction, it is not fair to the other exhibitors if you enter a market class without intending to sell your animal. Any exhibitor who decides not to sell their animals in the Poultry & Rabbit Market Sale, if eligible, will be barred from the Market Classes & Sale for the next two (2) years.
- 4. If the exhibitor enters into the market class and the animal is selected, the animal MUST be sold at the auction.
- 5. There will be a Grand Champion market animal and Reserve Champion for the Poultry and the Rabbits.

WHEN IS THE SALE

The Poultry and Rabbit Market Sale will be held on Thursday, August 21, at 6:30pm, in the Multi-Purpose Building.

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WHO CAN BUY

- 1. Anyone interested in encouraging youth.
- 2. Anyone who enjoys and appreciates good quality meat.
- 3. Anyone who would gain beneficial advertising value.

SALE PROVISIONS

- 1. Potential bidders register at the Sales ring (no obligations).
- 2. Animal weights will be provided, but bidding will be based on an entry basis; i.e., meat pen, pair or single animal class entry.
- 3. All accounts are to be settled with the clerk immediately after sale. The buyer will assume ownership of the animal if taken live after 6pm on Sunday. All market animals should remain for the duration of the Fair.
- 4. Sale participants must be present when their animal is called to the auction block or they forfeit the right to sell. The only exception is if they must report to college on the day of the sale.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Entries open to all bona fide 4-H or FFA members or any other youth organization in Manitowoc County.
- 2. Make entries on regular County Fair Registration Form under the respective market classes noted on the website at the Fair Website.
- 3. The number of animals exhibited and the number of premiums given will follow County Fair regulations.
- 4. The sale will be conducted by the Manitowoc County Market Animal Committee on Thursday, August 22, at 6:30pm, in the Multi-Purpose Building. Ten (10) percent of the selling price will be deducted from the exhibitor's receipts to go into a fund to pay for advertising the sale and conducting the sale. Checks will be mailed to the exhibitors after the animals have been delivered to the buyers.

PULLORUM TESTING by the Manitowoc County Poultry & Rabbit Committee

PULLORUM Testing – <u>All poultry</u> except pigeons must be certified Pullorum-Typhoid free. Exhibitors must have proof that their birds are pullorum free when bringing them in on entry day at the Manitowoc County Fair. **Exhibitor must also submit a copy for permanent record.** When purchasing young birds, ask for paperwork (documentation) stating the animal is pullorum free. Birds must be tested at least three (3) weeks prior to the Fair.

Testing Dates Poultry and Rabbit Building on Manitowoc County Expo Grounds Monday, June 16, from 5pm-8pm Friday, July 11, from 5pm-8pm Tuesday, July 22, from 5pm-8pm

Anyone not having proof of testing cannot bring birds into the fair. This is a federal law. No testing will be done at fair. There will be no fee charged for Junior Fair Exhibitors. Please Note: The Poultry and Rabbit committee and Manitowoc County Expo are not responsible for testing outside of the specified dates and times listed above. All testing must be done by July 31. Must bring premise ID number on testing dates
