

# JUNIOR FAIR GOATS

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- 1. Entry Day Wednesday, August 20, animals placed by 3pm. Please note: if you are a market animal goat exhibitor. Market Goats please refer to Class N for entry day information.
- 2. Judging Day Saturday, August 23, starting at 9am, in the Multi-Purpose Building Show Ring. Open Class shows first, then Junior Fair to follow. Market Goats please refer to Class N for judging day information.
- 3. Release Day **Sunday, August 24**, market goats will be released at 4:30pm with the contract hauler only. All others will be released at 5:30pm along with decoration and pen breakdown.
- 4. Wether Goats in all breeds can only be shown in the wether class if they were not shown in the market class.
- 5. Pens will be assigned by the Junior Fair Goat Superintendent. All exhibitors must show with the youth organization whose leader approved the entry.
- 6. Each exhibitor must care for and feed the animal or make arrangements to have the animal fed or cared for and cleaned. All animals must be kept clean, fed, watered and in place until checkout time on Sunday. An inspection will be done daily after 8am by the Superintendent. If an animal is determined to be neglected in any way by the Superintendent and/or Expo board member, the Exhibitor will be notified. Failure to keep pen clean and animal fed could result in forfeiture of premiums and possibly excluded from participation the following fair year.
- 7. No changes will be allowed after registration forms are submitted.
- 8. Every goat must be provided with a collar. All body clipping must be done prior to the fair, only touch-up clipping is allowed.
- 9. Age will be computed from the opening day of the Fair.
- 10. Bucks may not be shown.
- 11. No horns allowed unless horns are specific breed standard.
- 12. Animals shall **not** be exhibited if due to freshen within two (2) weeks prior to the fair opening and the two (2) weeks after the fair opening.
- 13. No more than four (4) animals may be exhibited in Junior Fair.
- 14. **HEALTH REGULATIONS**: See WI County, District, & State Fairs **2025** Animal Health Rules and Regulations located on the website. Any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during the fair.
- 15. Tattoo or official scrapie ear tags are required on all goats brought to the fair.
- 16. The use of pinch or prong collars is not permitted.
- 17. Exhibitors must show their own animals. The same animal must be used in all heats and finals. If assistance is needed, it will be provided by the ring help.
- 18. Junior Fair exhibitors must wear their exhibitor number while showing. Failure to wear the exhibitor number will result in premium money forfeiture!

# **Classifications**

Classifications	
Junior Kid	Born after March 31 of exhibit year.
Junior Yearling	Born between July 1 and December 31 of previous year.
Senior Kid	Born between January 1 and March 31 of exhibit year.
Senior Yearling	Born before July 1 of previous year and less than twenty-four (24) months of age.
Herd	Consist of one (1) doe under one (1) year, one (1) yearling doe and one (1) doe two (2) years or older, all owned by the same exhibitor.
Junior Get-of-Sire	Consist of three (3) does under two (2) years that have never freshened, the get of one sire. The animals do
	not need to be owned by the same exhibitor.
Senior Get-of-Sire	Consist of three (3) does, at least one (1) to be in milk and get of one sire. The animals do not need to be owned by the same exhibitor, but all shall be in the senior age group.
Produce of Dam	Consists of two (2) does, any age, the produce of one doe. The animals shall be owned by a single
	exhibitor.
Dam and Daughter	One (1) doe any age and its dam. The animals do not need to be owned by the same exhibitor.



All exhibitors in this department must call the superintendent no later than two weeks prior to the County Fair (August 10) with the number of animals bringing and stalls needed. If the exhibitor is over/under of the called in amount by more than one (1) animal, there will be a penalty of not exhibiting at the next County Fair.

# CLASS N: MARKET GOATS (Danish Judging)

- All animals in this class are required to have an ear tag from the Manitowoc Market Animal Committee to be eligible to show. If you did not obtain an ear tag by April 30, exhibitor is not eligible to participate. In order to participate in the Market Animal Sale at the fair, the exhibitor MUST meet all of the Manitowoc County Market Animal Committee Requirements. If Exhibitor did not obtain ear tag or meet all other requirements, Exhibitor must enter into a different class.
- Entry Day for Market Goats Only Tuesday, August 19 between 10am-11:30am. Market goats must be penned by 2. 11:45am
- 3. Judging Day – Wednesday, August 20, in the Multi-Purpose Building, 11:15am.
- Release Day Sunday, August 24, starting at 4:30pm with the contract hauler. 4.
- 5. Wether Goats in all breeds can only be shown in the wether class if they were not shown in the market class.
- Market Goats minimum 50 pounds for meat animal sale. 6.
- 7.
- Animals must be under one (1) year of age at the time of the fair. Animals must be castrated. Castration marks/wounds must be fully healed by time of the fair. Animals must not 8. exhibit behavioral signs of still being intact males.
- Animals whose breed standards allow horns may be horned. All others must be disbudded. 9
- 10. Animals must be shorn to an even body length, excluding head and tail, within 7-10 days prior to fair.
- 11. No painting, powdering, or artificial coloring allowed.
- 12. Exhibitors are allowed to use halters or collars in the show ring. However, animals must wear a collar while in their stalls.
- 13. Animals do not need to be registered.
- 14. Animals must have a scrapie tag or be tattooed. If tattooed, the farm's tattooed herd prefix must be registered with the USDA's scrapie program. A copy of the farm's USDA letter will provide proof of herd prefix registration.
