## OPEN CLASS FLOWERS AND HOUSEPLANTS Department 115 – Superintendent – Dean Brendel – 920-917-4327

1. Open Class Registration Deadline – **July 15**. Register online at fair.manitowocountywi.gov.
2. Entry Day – **Monday, August 24**, starting at noon and **MUST be in place no later than 7pm**, in the Exhibition building.
3. Judging Day – **Tuesday, August 25**, at 10am.
4. Release Day – **Sunday, August 30**, between 6pm and 7:30pm. **Vehicle access will begin at 6:30pm through the northwest corner of the Main Parking lot (across the street from Meijer). Watch for signs. Line Up begins at 6:25pm. Exhibits released prior to release date and time will not receive premiums.**
5. Fee - \$.20 per entry for each exhibitor and paid at the time of registration.
6. **Exhibitor is limited to one (1) entry or exhibit per lot number.**
7. **No ceramic pots allowed.**
8. No altering or repair of flowers or plants after entry placement.
9. No artificial flowers may be used in artistic arrangements.
10. All materials used in arrangements (fresh or dried) **must be locally grown**, not florist material.
11. Flower colors may not be altered.
12. An arrangement of flowers should include foliage (evergreens, shrubs, leaves or branches are examples of foliage).
13. Accessories can be used unless stated otherwise.
14. A figurine is used to help the theme. It can be used as a container or a freestanding addition to an arrangement.
15. An arrangement listed for fresh flowers may not contain dried flowers.
16. All plants must be disease and insect free.
17. No plant, dried flower, or arrangement that has received a premium in a previous year may be re-entered.
18. **All plants must have been in possession of the exhibitor sixty (60) days prior to the fair. Exception: multiple plantings, such as terrariums and dish gardens and must have been growing together for at least six (6) weeks.**
19. All “any other” entries Must Be Identified on the entry tag.
20. Exhibitor responsible for watering their own house plants.
21. **Judge will stay ½ hour after judging for questions.**

## CLASS C: FRESH FLOWER BOUQUETS

1. Exhibitor must comply with the required number of blooms or exhibit will be disqualified.
2. Definitions:
  - a. Spike – Single Stem. Example: snapdragon, gladiolus, delphinium, etc.
  - b. Bloom – Single Blossom. Example: zinnia, peony, dahlia, etc.
  - c. Stem – The ascending part of a plant. Example: petunias, French marigolds, cosmos, phlox, etc.
3. Leave a little Foliage for interest.
4. No floral oasis allowed.
5. All bouquet must be in vases or low bowl.
6. All entries 4 stems, blooms, spikes, with foliage on.

3. No water – remove all foliage.

### CLASS F: HOUSE PLANTS

1. Rules for entering are the same as flowers.
2. Any hanging plant must be in a pot 12" or less and ready to hang with a hook.
3. All plants must be disease and insect free, well-groomed, and in clean pots with saucers.
4. Any house plant may not be in a pot over 10".
5. No artificial means of shining leaves.
6. **A plant that has received a ribbon in a previous year, may not be entered this year.**
