JUNIOR FAIR CLOTHING

1. Judging Day (Individual Conference Judging) – **Monday, August 24**, from noon-6pm in the Exhibition Building.
2. Release Day – **Sunday, August 30**, between 6pm and 7:30pm. Vehicle access begins at 6:30pm. **Vehicle access will begin at 6:30pm through the northwest corner of the Main Parking lot (across the street from Meijer). Watch for signs. Line Up begins at 6:25pm.** Exhibits released prior to release date and time will not receive premiums.
3. No changes will be allowed after the registration forms are submitted.
4. **Four (4) entries or exhibits per class per exhibitor.** Each exhibitor may enter four (4) articles of Clothing, plus two (2) more articles under the Clothing Revue project.
5. **One (1) entry per exhibitor per lot number.**
6. Identify all “any other” exhibit on entry tag and registration form.
7. Use safety pins to secure garments and belts on hangers.
8. Bring all garments on **wire hangers only**.
9. Garments will be accepted for exhibit only if they are clean and pressed and entry tags attached with a safety pin to top left side of the garment.
10. All poster boards must be white. All of the poster items must be sewn.
11. Garments may be of any fabric which is appropriate for the member, the pattern, and the occasion.
12. All exhibitors must be prepared to talk to the Judge on the following information: Fiber content, intended use and care, type of interfacing used if interfacing is necessary, and preparation of garment.

2. Garments entered in Clothing Revue may not be entered elsewhere.
3. Exhibitors may enter two (2) articles of clothing in Clothing Revue.
4. No changes will be allowed after registration forms are submitted.
5. After judging, all garments must be displayed on wire hangers for the duration of the fair.
6. Bring all garments on **wire hangers only**.
7. Use safety pins to attach garments and belts to hanger.
8. Entry tags must be attached with a safety pin to the top left side of the garment.
